Bordered by Italy, France, Germany, and Austria and Liechtenstein to the South, West, North, and East respectively, The sovereign state of Switzerland is a federal republic spread across western, central, and southern Europe. It's the actual melting pot of Europe, with four official languages, that consistently ranks among the world leaders in aspects related to the quality of life.

Home to renowned institutions, including two of continental Europe's highest entries - the ETH Zurich (Swiss Federal Institute of Technology) and Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL)(both placed among the global top 15), Switzerland is a proud host of one of Europe's most prestigious higher education systems. ETH Zurich and EPFL are closely followed by five more Swiss universities, ranked among the Global top 200, and nine others ranking under top 550 globally. Considering the population of the entire country, which is just 8.4 million (about the same as that of Virginia, USA), this is quite an incredible feat.

Apart from a strong presence in international rankings, Swiss universities also boast of a diversified international student body, as well as varying academic communities. Out of the eight ranked Swiss universities, four have secured places in the Global Top 100, in regards to the percentage of international students. The country also holds an impressive stand when compared to universities in other countries, regarding the percentage of international academic staff members.

searching for student accommodation through university or privately online. Some of the most popular house-renting websites in Switzerland include [Homegate](#), [Immostreet](#), [Immoscout](#), [Immomapper](#) and [Remax](#). The private rental market will cost you slightly more, but it will give you the chance to be more flexible during your search.

Zurich, Geneva, Lausanne and Basel are the most expensive and popular student cities in the country and the rental prices fluctuate as following for student accommodation:

- Zurich: From 1,700 CHF to 5,000 CHF depending on the location.
- Geneva: From 1,700 CHF to 5,000 CHF depending on the location. However, you could be able to find student accommodation with around 1,000 CHF per month if you search thoroughly.
- Lausanne: The prices in Lausanne are considerably lower than in Zurich or Geneva, fluctuating between 1,500 CHF to 2,800 CHF. Plus, did you know that Lausanne has its own student village? That way you can find affordable student housing and meet a lot of international students.
- Basel: Basel, compared to the aforementioned cities, is a rather student-friendly choice, as prices for student shared accommodation range between 1,400 CHF to 2,600 CHF.

SWITZERLAND VISA

A Swiss student visa will be required depending on the country of origin of the prospective student. Read below for more detailed information regarding the student visa procedure. There are two types of visa you can apply for in Switzerland:

- 1.C Visa: A short-term visa that allows you to stay in Switzerland for a short period of time. It can be used for summer schools, seminars or language schools that last up to three months (90 days).
- 2.D Visa: A long-term visa for people looking to study or work in Switzerland. International students are granted a Schengen visa for one year with the possibility of extension.



CARRER OPPORTUNITIES IN SWITZERLAND

When you have retained your residence permit and proven you have the necessary financial resources to study in Switzerland, you can work alongside your studies. In fact, the student residence permit allows for profit-earning activity, as long your university provides a statement confirming that your employment will not prolong the length of your studies.

In actual practice, many local and international students in Switzerland- work alongside their studies to earn pocket money and gain professional experience. For foreign students, the number of weekly work hours is limited to 15, but this is fairly flexible depending on the canton (in Geneva, for example, you can work up to 30 hours per week). Nevertheless, most people will advise you not to take on extra work, since the university workload is already quite heavy, depending on the faculty.

It is easier to find employment in the large urban centres like Geneva and Zurich. Each university has a job placement office that provides information on student employment. Wages vary between SFR 20 and SFR 35 according to the job and your skills.

CLIMATIC AND WEATHER CONDITIONS:

The climate is moderate with no excessive heat, cold or humidity. From July to August the daytime temperature range is 18 to 28 °C (65° - 82° F) and from January to February the range is -2 to 7 °C (28° - 45° F). In spring and autumn, the daytime temperature range is 8 to 15 °C (46° - 59° F).

SAFETY:

Switzerland is one of the safest countries in the world. According to the Global Peace Index (2019) Switzerland is ranked 10th out of 195 countries across the Globe.

LANGUAGE:

The four national languages of Switzerland are German, French, Italian and Romansh. All but Romansh maintain equal status as official languages at the national level within the Federal Administration of the Swiss Confederation. According to a recent study, almost 64 percent of Swiss speak German, 19.5 percent French, 6.6 per cent Italian and less than 0.5 per cent Romansh. Of all the foreign languages spoken in Switzerland, English is by far the most dominant and could soon become the main foreign language taught in schools in many cantons.

FUN FACTS!

- Federal democratic republic with bicameral legislature
- Divided into 26 cantons (similar to states)
- No official capital, but the ‘federal city’ is Bern
- Head of state/government is the seven-member Swiss Federal Council
- Representative president is chosen from Federal Council, but doesn’t gain any additional powers
- Part of the Schengen Area, but not the European Union
- The nation has its origins in the late 13th century, though it only came into being in its current form in the mid-19th century.
- The “CH” often used in reference to Switzerland stands for Confoederatio Helvetica, the original Latin name for what is now Switzerland.
