There are seven separate emirates that make up the UAE: Umm Al Quwain, Ras Al Khaimah, Fujairah, Dubai, Sharjah, Ajman, and Abu Dhabi. In addition, each of these individual emirates has its own exclusive culture. Although English and standard Arabic are the principal languages of these areas, you are also likely to come across those who speak Punjabi, Egyptian Spoken Arabic, Somali, Tagalog, Bengali, and a host of other languages. If you rely solely on the media to learn what the rest of the world is like, you might think the UAE is in a constant state of turmoil. However, this could not be further from the truth. The UAE is actually a safe and peaceful place to study. Students are likely to find the residents warm, welcoming, and willing to share their culture and learn about others. On-campus dormitories tend to have strict regulations for campus living, but there are also off-campus options where you can really live up the student life.

4. Sunny Weather

If you enjoy beautiful beaches and hot weather, then the UAE is definitely the right place for you to study abroad. Hitting up the beach is the perfect way to relax after hours of studying. Consider visiting popular sites such as Marina Beach or Jumeirah Public Beach in Dubai, or travel to Saadiyat Public Beach or Corniche Beach in Abu Dhabi for a good time. There is also little need to worry about getting too cold in this desert region. If you are concerned about the heat, there is no need to stress – most areas encourage students and residents to stay indoors when the temperatures go up. In addition, most buildings have air conditioning to keep everyone comfortable.

COSTS OF STUDYING IN U.A.E.

Tuition fees in the UAE vary widely across the country depending on university, location, level of study and course. For example, in Dubai, the UAE’s most expensive city, tuition fees for an undergraduate program ranges between 37,500 to 70,000 AED per year and a postgraduate program is between 55,000 to 75,000 AED per year. An extra 1,200 AED (330 USD) per month should generally be included for general living expenses.

Some universities will charge an annual fee for students taking between 12 to 16 credit hours (plus additional fees), but anything above or below will be charged per credit hour. In some other cases, no annual fee is charged, and tuition is based on the amount credit hours the student is taking.

That said, Emirati higher education institutions do offer scholarship programs and financial aid to international students to help fund their studies, so be sure to get in touch with the institution of your choice to inquire about their scholarship opportunities.

TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION

These are the most popular types of accommodation for students in the UAE:

- University housing (on-campus or off-campus housing): prices and facilities vary from one institution to another. For example, the United Arab Emirates University charges 1,300 EUR per semester, while the University of Sharjah charges between 565 and 1,970 EUR per year.
- Renting a flat: total costs vary depending on the type of apartment (1–3 rooms), the proximity to the city centre, and so on. Full rent for a flat will set you back between 730 and 2,000 EUR per month. Don’t forget about monthly utilities (150–230 EUR). Sharing an apartment with other students is a great way of reducing your overall expenses.

HOUSING AND LEAVING COST IN UAE

One of the most important factors to consider when studying abroad will be your budget. As a student, it’s important to think about what kind of accommodations you will have, how much travelling you plan to do, and whether you will try and find part-time work. The costs of living in the UAE will vary depending on the emirate you’re living in and your lifestyle.

Student accommodation is more accessible than private housing in the UAE, but it’s important to consider that some universities will have a limited number of student housing facilities and you may be required to find a private accommodation. Costs will vary depending on location and standard; Dubai is the most expensive of the seven emirates, followed by Abu Dhabi. Sharjah, Fujairah, and Al Ain are all less expensive options.

The cost of living in the UAE is quite high, so it’s important to plan your stay carefully and budget your finances. The good news is that international students can apply for a work permit in the UAE and can attain a job to help fund their study abroad journey.

U.A.E. VISA

In order to study in the UAE, you will need a student visa, also knows as a student residence visa. Student visas in the UAE must be sponsored by a higher education institution or by a local relative and are only valid for up to one year at a time and will have to be renewed annually.

Applicants will be required to cover the fees of the visa application and must take a medical fitness test upon arrival to the country.

International students aged 18 and over can apply for work permits for part-time jobs in the UAE. Therefore, you can apply for internships or jobs to help fund your expenses and build your resume while studying for a degree in the UAE.

LANGUAGE:

Although Arabic is the official language of the UAE, English is the most spoken language in Dubai. You will also find a lot of expatriates who speak Hindi, Urdu, Bengali, Tamil, Tagalog, Persian, Chinese, Malayalam, in addition to many other languages.

- The seven emirates are Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Ajman, Sharjah, Ras al-Khaimah, Fujairah and Umm al-Quwain.
