1. The campuses are as picturesque as the landscape

Students who've studied in New Zealand often fail to put into words the beauty of this country. It is bestowed with bountiful natural beauty that extends to all its universities' campuses too. Studying in New Zealand is nothing short of an extended vacation.

2. Excellent quality of programs & courses

All the programs offered by the state-funded universities in New Zealand undergo stringent quality checks. Even the non-university programs need to be approved by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA), a New Zealand government organization liable for quality control. In fact, you'll not get a student visa if the course you're planning to pursue in New Zealand isn't approved by a quality assurance body like NZQA.

3. British-based education system

New Zealand is a preferred destination among Indians because their education programs and degrees are based upon the British education system. Being a colony of the British Empire, it follows the tried and tested and globally recognized system of British education which is a little similar to the Indian education system.

4. Internationally Recognized World Class Institutions

New Zealand universities rank among the best in the world. In fact, all the 8 universities rank among the top 3% globally and also rank in QS World University Rankings. Graduating from any one of these universities will give you an edge over the others. The universities enroll fewer students and its excellent student-teacher ratio (an average of 6.7) allows you to have a close interaction with the teachers. The institutions have a well-balanced curriculum with equal weightage on practical and theoretical knowledge.

5. Abundance of job opportunities

According to Chris Whelan, the executive director of Universities New Zealand, after graduation, 97% of the students get employed and 90% of them get into job profiles that are relevant to the course they've pursued.

6. Affordable tuition fee

The average annual tuition fees and cost of living in New Zealand is comparatively cheaper than most popular study abroad destinations like the US, UK, Australia, Singapore, Canada, Hong Kong, Switzerland (2015 research by FAIRFX currency exchange.)

An MBA program in New Zealand is much less compared to those offered by many institutions in the Northern Hemisphere. In fact, international PhD students pay the same fees as domestic students of NZ

COSTS OF STUDYING IN THE NEW ZEALAND

New Zealand provides high quality courses with a high standard of living at lower cost than Australia, UK, and USA. The costs below will give you an idea of how much spending money you will need in New Zealand as it can vary from city to city. Tuition fees vary from programme to programme.

TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION

Most educational institutions in New Zealand will assist you in finding accommodation while studying in New Zealand. There are various types of accommodation which are available to international students. These are like Halls of Residence / Students Hostel, Homestay, Apartments / Flats. All students on finalising institution, should refer to its website for accommodation arrangements.

NEW ZEALAND VISA

NZ is the sole agency of the NZ Government responsible for migration & entry to NZ. Student visa is required to enter the country to study a course more than 3 months duration, also the course opted should be offered by education institutions approved & registered with NZQA. Student is issued a visa for One year duration could be & easily extended being in New Zealand as per the further duration of course. Visit our Visa counselor for personal guidance & documentation requirement for student visa. You can only get a student visa to study in a course at an education institution, which is registered and approved by the NZQA. Your student visa will be issued for the length of time your course tuition fees have been paid. You must pay your tuition fees in advance for the University to send you an official receipt and the Offer of Place Certificate, which also guarantees that accommodation will be available, which are required with your visa application. Acceptance by the University does not Guarantee that a student will be issued a student visa by the immigration authorities. Student visa and permit information and application forms can be obtained from any New Zealand Immigration Service branch office within New Zealand or overseas (contact the nearest New Zealand High Commission). You can also obtain all relevant information and forms from the New Zealand Immigration Service website, www.immigration.govt.nz However visit your Edwise counselor for personal guidance and the latest checklist.



EMPLOYMENT IN NEW ZEALAND

International students enrolled in a tertiary programme of study are eligible to work upto 20 hours per week during the academic year. Students can work full time (40 hrs) in New Zealand only during the summer holidays. The average wage for part time jobs is between 15 - 17 NZ\$ per hour. International students who have graduated from a course in New Zealand that would gain points under the Skilled Migrant Category may apply for a grand job search visa. Eligible student's partner may apply for a work permit, valid for the duration of the study course.

While the far north has subtropical weather during summer, and inland alpine areas of the South Island can be as cold as -10° C in winter, most of the country lies close to the coast, which means mild temperatures, moderate rainfall, and abundant sunshine.

New Zealand is safe for education according to the Global Peace Index 2019. New Zealand is ranked 2 out of 195 countries in the world

LANGUAGE:

Maori is the national language of new Zealand but English is the predominant language and a de facto official language of New Zealand. Almost the entire population speaks it either as native speakers or proficiently as a second language.

- Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom is the official queen of New Zealand. She is represented in the country by a governor general.
- New Zealand was the first country in the world to allow universal suffrage, allowing women to vote in 1893.
- New Zealand is famous for its adrenaline adventures, especially bungee jumping! The first commercial bungee jump was made by AJ Hackett in the Kawarau Bridge in Queenstown, back in 1988.
