COSTS OF STUDYING IN IRELAND

Tuition fees vary depending on the institution and the study programme. An example of tuition fees for 2019/2020 for undergraduate & postgraduate, non-E.U. students at a third level institution are as follows:

TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION

Third level students: The higher education system in Ireland is called Third Level Education or Tertiary Education.

Most third level institutions have on-campus student residences, often resembling small towns with on-site facilities such as shops, launderettes, restaurants etc.

Another popular option, particularly in the main cities is self-catering rented accommodation, often shared with other students. Students opting for this kind of accommodation are advised to arrive in the country two or three weeks prior to the start of the academic year in order to secure a place in a house/apartment.

Some third-level students opt for host family accommodation. This can be a good option for those leaving home for the first time as it helps to integrate them into the local community and the Irish way of life. Students are normally provided with their own room and with morning and evening meals.

IRELAND VISA

Visa for Ireland normally takes up to 4 to 5 weeks time and it is best to apply well in advance. A letter of acceptance from the college, confirming you have been accepted and enrolled on a course of full-time education, involving a minimum of 15 hours organised daytime study each week and evidence of financial support for tuition fees and living expenses are issued visas. Along with the visa form you need to submit personal information, academic qualifications, financial strengths equaling to € 10000 for each year as living expenses. Generally you are granted a visa for the entire duration of the course and the student visas are Multi Entry Visas. Edwise is the Member of "Trusted Agents Programme Ireland/ India" whereby Edwise students will accord priority treatment to visa applications with the minimum possible processing time. Edwise also has dedicated visa counselors who are trained in visa formalities to help the students with the above.



EMPLOYMENT IN IRELAND

Part Time: Only students attending a full time course of at least one year's duration leading to a qualification recognized by the Minister for Education and Science will be entitled to take up casual employment defined as up to 20 hours part time work per week or full time work during normal college vacation periods.

Full Time: Third Level Graduate Scheme: Students who have studied in Ireland and completed a qualification at either Level 9 (master's degree or post-graduate diploma) or Level 10 (doctoral degree) whose award is granted by a recognised Irish awarding body will be allowed to remain in Ireland for two years to seek employment. Students completing Level 8 programmes (honours undergraduate degrees) will continue to have a 12-month stay back option, whereas those completing a Level 7 qualification (ordinary undergraduate degree) will also remain eligible for a six-month stay back. These period of months starts from the day you receive exam results.

The climate of Ireland can be described as maritime influenced, mild and humid. May to mid-September is by far the warmest and generally the dryer time of year, relatively speaking. In summer, temperatures generally fall in a range of 15°C to 20°C, but sometimes they can reach up to 25°C or even higher

SAFETY:

Ireland is one of the safest countries in the world. According to the Global Peace Index (2019), it is ranked 12th among 195 countries in the world.

LANGUAGE:

The two principal languages of Ireland are English and Irish. Irish is considered the official and national language of the Republic of Ireland; Northern Ireland has no official language. However, English has been the dominant spoken language in both political areas since the end of the 19th century. English can never be a problem in this country as 98% of the population use English for communication.
