The Netherlands is one of the best countries in the world and shares borders with Belgium, Germany and the North Sea. About a quarter of this small northwestern European nation lies below sea level, giving the Netherlands its name. Known for its tolerant and liberal ethos, it's one of the most densely populated countries in Europe. None of the great student cities, which the country boasts about, is more than a bicycle ride (the nation's preferred mode of transport) away from the picturesque countryside!

One of the world's oldest and highly respected systems of higher education, which dates back to the 16th century, finds its home in The Netherlands. 13 universities in the Netherlands are ranked within the world's top 400, and an impressive eight of these are within the global top 150. The Delft University of Technology, ranking 54th in the world is the nation's highest-ranking institution, followed closely by the University of Amsterdam and Eindhoven University of Technology, globally ranked at 58th and 104th respectively.

Blend this with relatively favorable tuition rates, as well as an abundance of English language courses (the Dutch are well known for their fluency in English as a second language), and there's no doubt you can gauge why the Netherlands is one of Europe's most popular international study locations.

**TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION**

**Accommodation**

Most universities in Netherlands offer temporary, short stay solutions for foreign students upon arrival. If they are part of an exchange program or enrolled in an international course, it is very likely that they will be offered accommodation. Students can stay in various types of accommodation. They can choose to live in a student house or flat, which is a very common thing to do for Dutch students.

**Student house**

A vast majority of students in the Netherlands rent rooms in student houses, which are privately-owned houses designed to host three to six individuals.

**University housing**

Most universities in Netherlands offer student apartments or student houses through their housing offices or other housing organizations. Although both price and facilities are more or less the same as the privately-owned ones.

**NETHERLANDS VISA**

To study in Netherlands for Indian students, they will need the Long Stay Visa (MVV) / Residence Permit to study in Netherlands. This visa is made specifically for students who are ready to begin their study abroad adventure in Netherlands.

You should apply at least months before your university degree programme starts. After you've applied, you can expect that you'll wait about 1 to 90 days for the decision. Main steps to take for the Dutch student visa. Here are what Indian students have to do to get a student visa that will allow them to study in Netherlands:

After you are accepted to a university in Netherlands, the university applies for visa and residence permit on your behalf.

If the application is accepted you have to make an appointment at the embassy in India to collect the MVV and have your biometrics taken.

You will have to take a tuberculosis test after arriving in the Netherlands for your university studies as per the procedure.

Indian students may have to provide biometrics during the visa application process. You will have to attend a visa interview during the application process. The Long Stay Visa (MVV) / Residence Permit from Netherlands is valid for up to 3 months. So that you can stay during your entire degree programme, you may need to renew your visa every year. If you want to stay in Netherlands after your degree is over, you will have to apply for a different visa, or a visa renewal through the immigration office.



**CARRER OPPORTUNITIES IN NETHERLANDS**

If students wish to work, during their education in Netherlands, they need to apply for a TWV (Temporary Work Visa) work permit from UWV (Netherlands Employee Insurance Agency) and then they may work a maximum of 10 hours per week or for two months during the summer (June, July and August). A work permit is not required, however, for doing an Internship as a part of the course. The Internship Agreement, however, must be signed between the employer, the intern and the educational institution. Once their studies in the Netherlands are complete, graduates who wish to work may apply for a search year. This is a residence permit for one year that allows graduates to look for a job in the Netherlands. Netherlands is ranked quite highly according to the OECD Better Life Index. A thriving economy offering a wealth of job and career opportunities is one of the best reasons to work in the Netherlands.

### CULTURE:

Cuisine: Dutch cuisine is formed from the cooking traditions and practices of the Netherlands. The country's cuisine is shaped by its location in the fertile North Sea river delta of the European Plain, giving rise to fishing, farming and trading over sea, its former colonial empire and the spice trade. Dutch cuisine has become more cosmopolitan and most international cuisines are represented in the major cities.

Sports: Football is the most popular sport in the Netherlands, with field hockey and volleyball as the second and third most popular team sports. Ice-skating, tennis, gymnastics, golf, baseball, rugby union, cricket, handball.

### CLIMATIC AND WEATHER CONDITIONS:

The Netherlands have a temperate maritime climate influenced by the North Sea and Atlantic Ocean, with cool summers and moderate winters. Daytime temperatures vary from 2°C-6°C in the winter and 17°C-20°C in the summer.

### SAFETY:

Netherlands is considered a very safe country for education as according to the Global Peace Index (2019) Netherlands is ranked 17th out of 195 countries in the World.

### LANGUAGE:

The official language of the Netherlands is Dutch, spoken by almost all people in the Netherlands. Dutch is also spoken and official in Aruba, Bonaire, Belgium, Curaçao, Saba, Sint Eustatius, Sint Maarten and Suriname. It is a West Germanic, Low Franconian language that originated in the Early Middle Ages (c. 470) and was standardised in the 16th century. English language in the Netherlands refers to the use of the English language in the Netherlands. Research states that between 90% and 93% of the Dutch population claims to be able to converse in English.

### FUN FACTS!

- Part of the Kingdom of the Netherlands (together with the Caribbean islands of Aruba, Curaçao and Sint Maarten)
- Constitutional parliamentary monarchy with bicameral legislature, headed by prime minister (currently Mark Rutte)
- Around the same size as Switzerland
- Part of the Benelux economic union, along with Belgium and Luxembourg.
- One of the flattest countries in the world; the highest point is only 321 meters above sea level
- The Netherlands boasts 15,000km (9,320 miles) of bicycle tracks – and this is a conservative estimate.
- Dutch people are the tallest in Europe, on average.
