WHY CHOOSE CANADA?

1.A Quality Education

One of the most important reasons international students prefer to study in Canada is the quality of Canadian education. A Canadian degree is globally recognized to be at par with one from the US, Australia, or the UK. Canadian universities consistently stay on top of the list in international rankings. In fact, in 2016, three Canadian universities ranked among the top 50 universities in the world. Whether you choose to attend a university, college, or trade school, you'll have a lot of options to choose from and there's no doubt that Canadian education is world-class.

2. Affordable

Cost is one of the biggest barriers for many students who wish to study abroad. International students have to pay higher tuition fees than domestic students but the typical annual tuition for an international student’s undergraduate degree was \$16,746 USD in 2014 in comparison to the U.S. (\$24,914 USD), Australia (\$24,081 USD) or the UK (\$21,365 USD ). Apart from paying tuition, international students also require housing and finance for daily activities. The average cost of living in Canada is much more affordable compared to most other top study destinations. In 2014, the average cost of living per annum for international students in Canada was \$13,021 USD. When you combine the average annual cost of living and annual tuition fees, Canada is one of the most affordable study destinations.

3. Work While You Study

Canada might be a comparatively affordable option, but we all know that studying abroad is generally expensive. Luckily, international students are permitted to work up to twenty hours per week during school terms and full-time (30 hours/week) during breaks like summer vacation. Most students don’t require a separate work permit while they are studying, irrespective of whether their job is on-campus or off-campus.

4. Safety

A constituent of a democratically elected government, as well as the fundamental rights and freedoms of its inhabitants being protected by the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, proves Canada to be fitting of an international reputation for having a tolerant and non-discriminatory society. A fifth of Canada’s entire population is made up of Immigrants. Canadian laws assure that all people are protected from discrimination, regardless of their circumstance.

5. Immigration Options

As an international student, you usually get a temporary status in the country you’re studying in which usually expires when your program ends and you have to return home. Canada has a lot of programs developed especially to encourage international students to transition to permanent residence after completing their program. Post-Graduation Work Permit lets graduates stay and work on an open work permit after graduation and provides an opportunity to get Canadian work experience.

**COSTS OF STUDYING AND LIVING IN THE CANADA**

**TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION**

Most of the educational institutions in Canada will assist you in finding accommodation while studying in Canada. Accommodations are of two types

- Students can stay On campus (Residence/ Dormitory)
- Off campus (Homestay/Apartments/Flats).

Staying Off campus is much cheaper than staying On Campus. Its always advisable that the student should stay On campus for the first six months.

**CANADA VISA**

All overseas students are required to obtain a Student Authorization and Visa before going to Canada for studies. Students must also meet the requirements of the Canadian Immigration Act and Regulations. Under normal circumstances, allow at least 4-6 weeks for your visa to be processed. Students are not allowed to obtain an authorization after their arrival in Canada. The application should be submitted well in advance of the planned date of departure to ensure that the processing of the application can be completed on time. Submit the completed application kit to the immigration section of the Canadian High commission. Kindly note that all documents submitted, must be photocopies. One can also apply for a Study permit online.



**PART TIME EMPLOYMENT IN CANADA**

International students are allowed to work up to 20 hours per week off - campus during term time and 40 hrs per week in their vacation. They can earn approximately C\$11-C\$14 per hour. Students can work full - time off campus during co-op terms, amounting to between C\$ 700 to C\$ 900 per month.

International students graduating from a program of 2 years or more in length may be eligible for a 3 year work permit after graduation with no restrictions on the types of employment and no requirement for a job offer. The experience gained would provide them an opportunity to work in an international setting and at the same time allow them to earn the money invested.

**WORK PERMIT**

Canada is encouraging International Students to stay back after their studies. The new Work Permit Program states that International students who have studied for 2 years can obtain an Open Work Permit with no restrictions on the type of employment and no requirements of a Job offer upto 3 years. Students who study a one year program are eligible to apply for a Work Permit upto one year.
