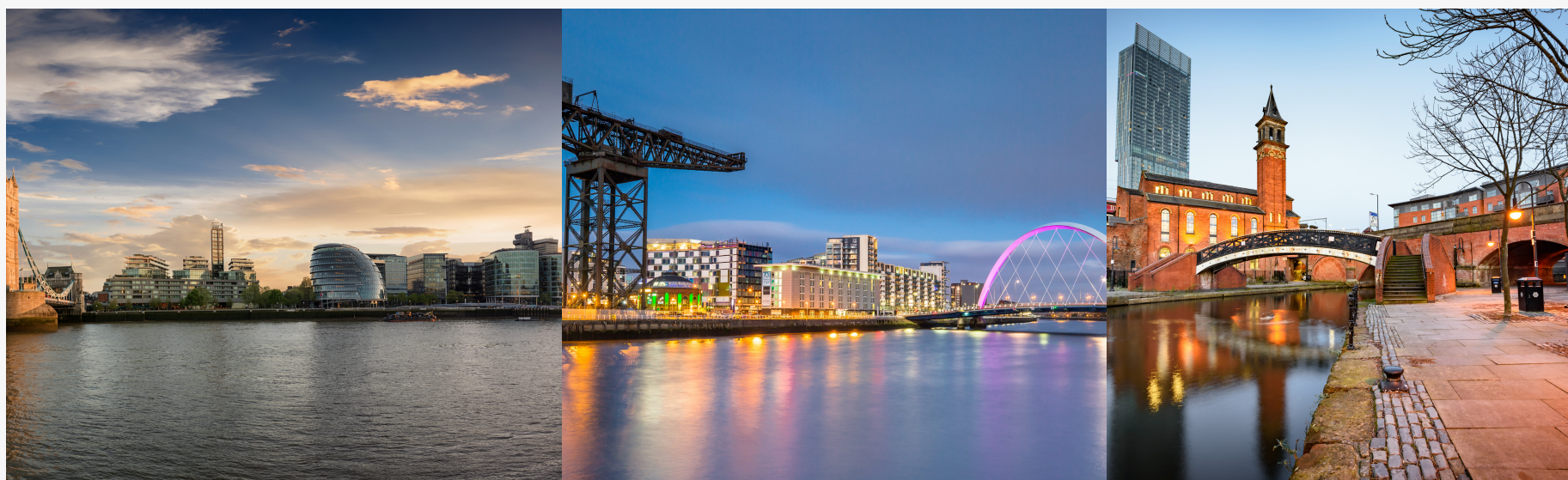

1. Home to some of the World’s Best Universities

Studying within the United Kingdom means studying at a globally renowned institution. The UK currently has six institutions within the Global University Rankings with Universities of Oxford and Cambridge both scoring 100% when it involves their academic reputations. There’s a reason why the United Kingdom produces 14% of the world’s most-cited research papers!

2. Internationally Recognized Degrees and Qualifications

Given the standard of the UK's educational institutions, you can be rest assured that your degree from the UK is going to be held in high regard by employers all over the globe. 3. A Cheap Study Destination

The UK is substantially cheaper than most English-speaking international study destinations like the US and Australia when it comes to paying for higher education. Tuition fees in the UK are comparatively cheaper than the United States and Australia.

4. A Huge (and Growing!) Student Population

There are universities and colleges in nearly every city in the UK, meaning that, wherever you go, there's a thriving student population! UK student numbers rise per annum across all education levels so you'll always be surrounded by like-minded individuals from diverse backgrounds

5. Free Healthcare to Keep You Healthy

The National Health Service means if you're studying in the UK for six months or more you're eligible to access completely free healthcare. However, you will need to buy medicines, but this is usually also capped under the NHS and you'll only need to pay £8.60 per item, no matter how expensive the medicines you've been prescribed.

6. Work Opportunities While You Study

Your student visa makes you eligible to work up to 20 hours per week in a part-time job. The UK also has a guaranteed minimum wage, meaning you could earn a minimum of £118.00 before tax per week to help fund your studies. You can also explore internship opportunities through your university at one of the many globally famous UK based companies like the BBC, Rolls Royce, or Burberry. One way or another, your resume will look great after completing your international education experience.

COSTS OF STUDYING IN THE U.K. – VALUE FOR MONEY

The most apparent advantage of studying in the UK is the lesser duration of the programs: 3yrs for an UG degree and only 1 year for a Masters degree. This means lesser expenses than other destinations (like the US, CANADA, AUSTRALIA)

TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION

Both Undergraduate and Postgraduate Students have guaranteed accommodation by many universities in their Halls of Residence, for at least their first year at the university provided they inform the university within the given deadlines.

- On Campus : College hostels (self catered or fully catered)
- Off Campus : Renting a flat / apartment
- Homestay : With families near the institution.

U.K. VISA

A Student Visa is relatively easy to obtain. The process is further simplified by introducing PBS (Point Based System) wherein you need to achieve 40 points to make you eligible to get the Student Visa. In addition to our academic counselors at Ranchal, we also have dedicated visa counselors, who are trained in visa formalities to help students to get the required points. It is important to have a CAS certificate to be issued by a licensed sponsor in the prescribed format to get 30 points and 10 points for maintenance. The Normal length of visa will be the full length of the course plus 4 to 6 months depending upon the length of the program



PART TIME EMPLOYMENT IN U.K.

- Students can work upto 20 hours a week during term time and full time during vacations.
- If you are going to study below degree level (excluding foundation degree students) you will only be able to work 10 hours a week.
- Dependents : Student who enroll for the following courses of Post Graduate Certificate, Post graduation Certificate in Education, Post Graduate Diploma of a Masters degree at a university for which the duration is more than 12 months can sponsor a dependent. The dependents will be allowed to work.
- Students can earn around £ 5 - £ 7 per hour i.e. approx £375 - £525 per month during term.
- Students can work full time during vacations.
- Students could look out for part-time jobs by looking at the local newspapers and job shops as well as the University and College Career Cells where information is available about vacancies. However, please note that students are not guaranteed part time employment by the University.
- If you are going to the UK as a student for six months or less, you cannot work nor extend your visa further

STAY BACK OPTION

- UK Graduate Immigration Route : 2 years Post Study Work right.
- The new route will be launched in the summer of 2021, This means that any eligible student who graduates in the summer of 2021 (Academic Year 2020-21)will be able to apply for the route. This includes students who have already started their courses.
- Student can apply under the route after completion of their program and within the validity of their visa, to gain exposure.

CLIMATIC AND WEATHER CONDITIONS:

The UK has a temperate climate. In general, this means that Britain gets cool, wet winters and warm, wet summers. It rarely features the extremes of heat or cold, drought or wind that are common in other climates. The weather conditions are also very changeable.

SAFETY:

The UK was recently voted as the safest place to live while studying overseas, as part of an online opinion poll of over 800 students from more than 80 countries, conducted by Education Intelligence via The Student Room online forum. According to Global Peace Index UK ranked 45 out of 195 countries.

LANGUAGE:

English is the main and official language of the UK. After English, Welsh, and Polish, the next most widely spoken languages are Indian and Pakistani ones like Urdu, Bengali, Gujarati, and Punjabi, which together account for about a million people.

FUN FACTS!

- The United Kingdom has 31 heritage sites protected by UNESCO.
- Did you know that the first postage stamp was created in the UK? It was designed in May 1840 and it featured the figure of Queen Victoria.
- The University of Oxford is the oldest higher education institution in the whole UK. Until 1877, lecturers at this university were not allowed to get married.
- Tea is by far the most popular drink among Brits. It is estimated that they drink on average 165 million cups of tea every day. The fun thing here is that in the US the tea’s consumption is 20 times lower.
- The UK has only 15 National Parks but they cover 8% of the British land.
